### Year 4 Key Information

### Home Learning

**Reading** Pupils will bring a school reading book home and a reading for pleasure book every day. Please can this be returned daily as the book is used daily in school as part of their guided reading session.

**Maths and English** This homework will be set in their CGP workbook on a Wednesday to be completed by the following Monday.

**TTRS** Each pupil has their own TTRS log in. They will get most benefit from at least 3, 10 –20 minute sessions a week. Y4 will take part in the Statutory Times Table Screening in Spring 2023 so regular practice is very important.
